Admission

1. Notwithstanding [General Academic Regulations - Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level](#), applicants shall possess:
 - i. a first or second class Honours degree in an appropriate discipline from a United Kingdom university or an overseas university with equivalent academic degree; or
 - ii. a professional qualification deemed by the Head of Department acting on behalf of the Senate to be equivalent to (i) above.
2. In all cases, applicants whose first language is not English, shall be required to demonstrate an appropriate level of English.

Duration of Study

Mode of study

4. The programme is available by full-time study only.

Place of Study

Examination, Progress and Final Assessment

8. The final award will be based on performance in the examinations and coursework together with the dissertation where undertaken.

Award

9. **Degree of MSc:** In order to qualify for the degree of MSc in Applied Translation, a candidate must have performed to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners and must have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits, of which 60 must have been awarded in respect of the dissertation or a translation/interpreting project R5904.
10. **Postgraduate Diploma:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Applied Translation, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits from the taught programme curriculum.
11. **Postgraduate Certificate:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Applied Translation, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the taught programme curriculum.
