Degree of LLM International Commercial Law with a specialisation in Antitrust Law: In order to qualify for the award of LLM International Commercial Law with a specialisation in Antitrust Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits, which must include all of the taught compulsory modules of the programme curriculum and one of the 60 credit modules.
