Progress

- Part-time students for the degree of LLM, MSc or Postgraduate Diploma shall normally require 40 credits to progress to year two.

Award

- Degree of LLM in International Maritime Law:** In order to qualify for the award of LLM in International Maritime Law, a candidate must normally have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum and one of the 60-credit modules listed above.
- Degree of MSc in International Maritime Law:** In order to qualify for the award of MSc in International Maritime Law, a candidate must normally have accumulated no fewer than 180 credits including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum and one of the 60-credit modules listed above.
- PG Diploma in International Maritime Law:** In order to qualify for the award of PG Diploma in International Maritime Law, a candidate must normally have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum.

11. **PG Diploma in Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 120 credits from the 3 taught modules from the programme curriculum.
12. **PG Certificate in International Maritime Law:** In order to qualify for the award of PG Certificate in International Maritime Law, a candidate must normally have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits including all taught compulsory modules from the programme curriculum.
13. **PG Certificate in Law:** In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Law, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the 3 taught modules from the programme curriculum.
