Postgraduate Certificate in Social Research Methods

These regulations are to be read in conjunction with <u>General Academic Regulations</u> - Postgraduate Taught Degree Programme Level.

Admission

1. Applicants are normally required to possess a Master (MSc) degree of a United Kingdom university or a qualification deemed to be equivalent by the Senate.

Duration of Study

2. The programme will normally be complete within 9 months (full-time) or 18 months (part-time).

Place of Study

3. The programme will involve study time based at Strathclyde.

Mode of Study

4. The programme is available by full-time or part-time.

Curriculum

5. All students shall undertake modules amounting to no fewer than 60 credits as follows:

Examination, Progress and Final Assessment

Award

7. **Postgraduate Certificate**: In order to qualify for the award of the Postgraduate certificate in Social Research Methods, a candidate must have accumulated no fewer than 60 credits from the programme curriculum.
