Driveway Repairs by Scottish Water



In March this year we advised members of Scottish Water’s plans to commence works resurfacing the upper section of the Ross Priory driveway, the section they are fully responsible for from the Lodge to the Y-junction. Motorists, cyclists and pedestrians alike have been delighted with the much needed, newly improved surface on this section.

Scotland's Gardens Scheme 2023

Many thanks go to our grounds team, under the leadership of Head Gardener, Tony, for another very successful Open Day in May. The gardens are looking beautiful as ever and many new visitors and members alike enjoyed sharing in this. The event is held annually and we look forward to its return next year.



Sequoiadendron Gignateum

Sadly, the decision had to be taken this year to fell a Giant Redwood (Sequoiadendron Giganteum) adjacent to the car park in the grounds.

The tree itself was around 200 years old and reached the height of approximately 37m, but with a lesion of around 7m in its main trunk and seeping bacterial slime from a smaller wound near the base, the resistograph tests and other investigations showed that there was only a narrow band of healthy sapwood around its circumference, resulting in the specialists recommending it be felled for health and safety reasons. Our team is saddened that it had to come to this, as they take great pride in the work that they do and the University would only take this action where necessary.
